The General Secretary (AIPSSCB) has requested the host Member Organizations to finalize the Venue / dates in consultation with respective Sports Federation and intimate to the Board at the earliest so that the participating teams may firm up their travel plans well in advance.

ITEM NO. 4.**ANY OTHER POINT WITH THE PERMISSION OF THE CHAIR**

- 4.1 Shri T.V. Subramaniam, Advisor (AIPSSCB) proposed sponsorship of Prizes in respect of All India Inter University Tournaments which are a major source from where players merge for the country. Initially he proposed sponsoring of prizes for the All India Inter-University Women's Hockey Tournament 2026-27 by the Public Sector Sports Promotion Board (AIPSSCB) giving justifications as under:



- Hockey is central to India's sporting pride. The All India Inter University Hockey Tournament is one of main events from where national talent emerges — today's university final scorer could represent India at the 2028 Olympics in case India qualifies.
- Hockey promotes service before self, teamwork, and resilience under pressure—core principles that drive major PSUs like BHEL, SAIL, ONGC, IOCL, FCI, AAI, LIC, etc.
- This sponsorship directly fulfils the dual mandate of PSUs to balance financial growth with social impact.

➤ **Advantage to AIPSSCB & Member PSUs**

- Prominent display of the AIPSSCB logo on trophies and awards, reinforcing leadership in grassroots sports development.
- Direct interaction with elite performers, facilitating in identifying talent for recruitment and scholarship opportunities for member organizations.

➤ **National Impact** - Establishes a benchmark for public sector support in university-level sports.

Shri TV Subramaniam requested the Board for Supporting this tournament which will be a laudable step forward in elevating university sports and nurturing India's future champions

The President advised the General Secretary (AIPSSCB) to nominate a three-member committee to examine the proposal of Shri T.V. Subramaniam in detail and thereafter place it to the Executive Board for consideration.



- 4.2 Shri Amrish Gautam (a former Joint Secretary, AIPSSCB) suggested introducing a scholarship scheme to financially support upcoming, talented athletes and help enhance their skills.

While appreciating the proposal, the General Secretary (AIPSSCB) noted that many member PSUs already offer their own schemes. He cited Airports Authority of India (AAI) as an example, which provides lucrative scholarships, contractual engagements and intensive training to prepare athletes for national and international competitions. He notified that a Board-level scholarship might conflict with member PSUs' existing programs, but assured the house that alternative initiatives would be introduced to support talented sportspersons.

ITEM NO. 5

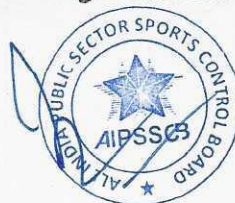
FILLING UP OF VACANT POST IN THE BAORD FOR THE PRESENT TERM UPTO 31st MARCH, 2029

- 5.1 Appointment of a new General Secretary for the present term of the Board i.e. upto 31st March, 2029, as the incumbent, Shri Gian Batra (Regional Executive Director, AAI), has superannuated from the services of AAI on June 30, 2026.

Shri Suneel Dutt, Executive Director (CNS), AAI presently holding the post of Vice President (AIPSSCB) was unanimously nominated as GENERAL SECRETARY (AIPSSCB)

- 5.2 **Ms. S. Girija**, Executive Director (HRD & Trg.), LIC and **Shri Harpreet Tuteja**, Chief General Manager (Corporate Affairs) HPCL were unanimously nominated as VICE PRESIDENT (AIPSSCB) and JOINT SECRETARY (AIPSSCB) respectively against vacant posts.

- 5.3 The house authorized President (AIPSSCB) to fill up the other vacant posts or the posts which arise within the present term of the Executive Board i.e. 2025-29 in consultation with General Secretary (AIPSSCB) & on receipt a recommendation from the concerned member organizations



- 5.4** Due to the change of General Secretary, the Board is required to pass the following resolution specifying the name of the newly elected General Secretary, in accordance with Clause XV (8) of the Constitution of the Board, which authorizes: *"The operation of the account by the General Secretary and the Treasurer. In the event that either is absent, the account may be operated by the President, the Executive Vice President, or one of the Vice Presidents."*
- 5.5** According it was **RESOLVED & DECIDED THAT "Shri Suneel Dutt, General Secretary (AIPSSCB) & Executive Director (CNS) –AAI, Sh. O.P. Dani, Treasurer (AIPSSCB) & Chief General Manager (FCI) and Shri Niraj Priyadershi Vice President (AIPSSCB) & Director (Fin.) CWC are nominated as authorized signatories of the AIPSSCB. Any of the two executives i.e. Vice President, General Secretary and Treasurer are authorized to operate the Bank Accounts of the All India Public Sector Sports Control Board."**

Shri Ramesh Sachdeva, Consultant (AIPSSCB), closely monitored the performances across various events organized nationwide within a remarkably short period.
